

Constitutional Supremacy & American Rule of Law

Dr. Razack believes the United States Constitution is the supreme law of the land and must remain the sole foundation of American governance, civil liberties, and judicial authority.

America is a constitutional republic governed by the rule of law not by foreign legal systems, international ideological movements, or unelected outside influences. Every elected official takes an oath to support and defend the Constitution of the United States. That oath must be honored without compromise.

Dr. Razack opposes the application, enforcement, or recognition of any foreign legal system including Sharia law where it conflicts with the U.S. Constitution, federal law, state law, individual liberty, due process, equal protection, property rights, religious freedom, freedom of speech, or the Second Amendment.

1. Constitutional Supremacy

Affirm that the United States Constitution and duly enacted American laws shall remain the highest legal authority governing the nation.

2. Reject Foreign Legal Systems

Oppose the application, enforcement, or recognition of foreign legal systems, including Sharia law or any foreign doctrine, where such systems conflict with the U.S. Constitution, individual liberties, state law, or federal law.

3. Protect Individual Constitutional Rights

Defend:

- Freedom of speech
- Freedom of religion
- Equal protection under the law
- Due process

- Property rights
- Rights guaranteed under the Bill of Rights
- 2nd Amendment

No foreign legal ideology should ever supersede the constitutional protections guaranteed to American citizens.

4. Preserve Judicial Integrity

Ensure that American courts base decisions solely on:

- The U.S. Constitution
- Federal law
- State constitutions
- State statutes
- Established American legal precedent

5. Require Oath Fidelity

Support stronger accountability measures for public officials who knowingly undermine constitutional protections or violate their oath of office.

6. Protect National Sovereignty

Oppose international agreements, foreign influence operations, or external governing bodies that attempt to weaken American sovereignty or constitutional self-government.

7. Promote Civic & Constitutional Education

Encourage stronger education regarding:

- The Constitution
- Federalism
- Separation of powers
- Individual liberty

- Civic responsibility
- American legal principles
